The world needs to stop taking water for granted

Sustainable water management is critical to address impending food and nutrition security threats

- The World Food Day was established in 1945 by the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO), a specialized agency of the United Nations.
- For the year 2023, the theme of the World Food Day is –
 "Water is life, water is food. Leave no one behind".

Do you know?

- Water availability affects every aspect of human life, especially food and nutrition security.
 - For instance, about 60% of India's net sown area is rainfed, contributing to 40% of the total food production
- About 40% of the planet's total land area is degraded, leaving farmers with less productive land.
 - Small-scale farmers, who make up more than 80%
 of farmers globally, are especially affected as they
 often lack access to finance, technology and
 irrigation to maintain a level of production that can
 sustain their livelihoods.

Israel, Hamas, and the laws of war

What are the international laws when it comes to questions of war, civilian attacks, hostage-taking etc? Is collective punishment for a crime conducted by specific persons legal? Is the warning given by Israel to Gaza residents to evacuate adequate?



- There are two separate and independent international in law questions related to wars.
 - First, under what conditions or when can countries use force in their international relations? This is known as *jus ad bellum*, regulated by the United Nations (UN) Charter.
 - Second, how is a war to be fought, that is, what military actions are permissible? This is known as jus in bello.
 - Assuming a country is justified under the UN Charter to use force, it still must ensure that it satisfies jus in bello obligations.
- The 'how' of using force or the law of war is known as international humanitarian law (IHL), which provides the rules that must be followed during an armed conflict.
 - IHL is contained in customary international law, the Geneva Conventions of 1949 and the Additional Protocols of 1977. It regulates the conduct of the parties or groups engaged in an armed conflict.

- The Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP) is a free trade agreement (FTA) between the ten member states of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) (Brunei, Cambodia, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, Myanmar, the Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, Vietnam) and its five FTA partners (Australia, China, Japan, New Zealand and Republic of Korea).
- At present, the RCEP members represent 30% of the global GDP.
- India walked out of the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP) agreement.
 - India's concerns over Chinese goods flooding the Indian market through other markets under the RCEP, without clear guidelines on rules of origin

Citing deepfakes, Govt looks at IT rules to make WhatsApp disclose source ID

The basis for this are multiple deepfake videos of politicians circulating on WhatsApp, and the government is understood to be in the process of sending an order to the messaging company under the Information Technology (IT) Rules, 2021, seeking the identity of the people who first shared the videos on the platform.



- Deepfakes are digital media video, audio, and images edited and manipulated using Artificial Intelligence.
 - It is basically hyper-realistic digital falsification.
- Deepfakes are created to inflict harm on individuals and institutions.
- Access to commodity cloud computing, public research
 Al algorithms, and abundant data and availability of vast
 media have created a perfect storm to democratise the
 creation and manipulation of media.
 - This synthetic media content is referred to as deepfakes.
- Deepfakes can be used to damage reputation, fabricate evidence, defraud the public, and undermine trust in democratic institutions.

What the GI tag can mean for the cashew industry in Goa

How did cashew come to Goa, and how did it become a major contributor to its economy? What challenges were cashew producers facing recently, and how will the GI tag help them?

- Goan cashew (kernel) got the geographical indication (GI) tag.
 - Cashew was native to northeast Brazil in Latin America and was introduced to Goa by the Portuguese in the 16th century (1570).
 - At the time of its introduction on Indian coasts, cashew was known mainly as a crop for afforestation and soil conservation.

Do you know?

 A GI tag is conferred upon products originating from a specific geographical region, signifying unique characteristics and qualities. Essentially, it serves as a trademark in the international market. It is given by the Geographical Indications Registry in Chennai.

The President of India, Smt Droupadi Murmu paid homage to Dr APJ Abdul Kalam, former President of India on his birth anniversary at Rashtrapati Bhavan today (October 15, 2023).



- Born on 15th October 1931 at Rameswaram in Tamil Nadu, Dr. Avul Pakir Jainulabdeen Abdul Kalam, specialized in Aeronautical Engineering from Madras Institute of Technology.
- Dr. Kalam made significant contribution as Project
 Director to develop India's first indigenous Satellite
 Launch Vehicle (SLV-III) which successfully injected
 the Rohini satellite in the near earth orbit in July
 1980 and made India an exclusive member of Space
 Club.
- He was responsible for the evolution of ISRO's launch vehicle programme, particularly the PSLV configuration.
- He was responsible for the development and operationalisation of AGNI and PRITHVI Missiles and for building indigenous capability in critical technologies through networking of multiple institutions.
- He led to the weaponisation of strategic missile systems and the Pokhran-II nuclear tests in collaboration with Department of Atomic Energy
