- The Protection of Children from Sexual Offenses (POCSO)
 Act, 2012 was enacted by Govt. of India to safeguard
 children from sexual abuse and sexual offences. The Act
 clearly defines a child as any person below the age of 18
 years. The POCSO Act provides punishment as per the
 gravity of offence.
- The Act was further reviewed and amended in 2019 to Introduce more stringent punishment including the death penalty for Committing sexual crimes on children, with a view to deter the perpetrators & prevent such crimes against children.

States in Court against their Governors

Tamil Nadu, Kerala and Punjab have approached the Supreme Court to decide a time-frame for which Governors have to either return or grant assent to Bills passed by Legislatures. Some of these Bills have been sitting with the Governors for years

Article 153. The Governor: There shall be a Governor each State. Provided that nothing in this Article shall prevent the appointment of the same person as Governor for two or more States. Article 163 makes it clear the Governor is not expected to act independently

UEX.

- Article 200 of the Constitution provides for four alternative courses of action for a Governor when a Bill after being passed by the legislature is presented to him for his assent.
- The Governor can give his assent straightaway or withhold his assent.
- He may also reserve it for the consideration of the President, in which case the assent is given or withheld by the President.
- The fourth option is to return the Bill to the legislature with the request that it may reconsider the Bill or any particular provision of the Bill. The Governor can also suggest any new amendment to the Bill.
- While it is true that Article 200 does not lay down any time frame for the Governor to take action under this Article, it is imperative on the part of the Governor to exercise one of the options contained therein.

India, Bhutan to discuss new routes of regional connectivity

King Jigme Khesar holds talks with PM; the two sides agree to go ahead with the final survey for the 58-km crossborder rail link between Gelephu and Kokrajhar in Assam; they will also explore a second rail link between Bhutan and West Bengal



- India and Bhutan agreed to discuss new routes of regional connectivity and upgrade border and immigration posts to support Bhutan's fifth King's plans for a smart city at Gelephu on the border between Bhutan and Assam.
- Apart from a decision to go ahead with the final survey for the 58-km crossborder rail link between Gelephu and Kokrajhar in Assam to be built by India, the two sides agreed to explore a second rail link for about 18 km between Samtse in Bhutan and Banarhat in West Bengal tea gardens area. India also agreed to allow Bhutanese trade items to be carried further on from Haldibari in West Bengal to Chilahati in Bangladesh. The rail connectivity could in the future assist air connectivity for Indians in the northeast as well, as Bhutan plans to build an international airport at Gelephu as part of the larger Sarpang district Special Economic Zone

- Under the provision of Section-12 of RTI Act 2005 the Central Government shall, by notification in the Official Gazette, constitute a body to be known as the Central Information Commission.
- The Central Information Commission shall consist of the Chief Information Commissioner (CIC) and such number of Central Information Commissioners not exceeding 10 as may be deemed necessary.
- The Chief Information Commissioner, or Information Commissioners, as the case may be, shall hold office for a period of three years from the date on which he enters upon his office.

Govt launches 'Bharat Atta' at subsidised rate to support consumers

- Centre formally launched the sale of wheat flour at a subsidised rate of Rs 27.50 per kg under the brand name 'Bharat Atta' across the country to provide relief to consumers from high prices.
- 'Bharat Atta' will be sold through cooperatives NAFED, NCCF and Kendriya Bhandar via 800 mobile vans and 2,000-odd outlets spread across the country.

Odd-even scheme back in Delhi: Has it helped bring down air pollution in the past?

The scheme will be implemented for the fourth time in Delhi. Here are the facts, and what the past experience shows.

- When odd-even is in force, cars can ply only on alternate days, based on their registration number.
- So, cars with numbers ending in an odd digit will be allowed on the street on odd dates (November 13, 15, 17, and 19), and those with numbers ending in an even digit will be allowed on even dates (November 14, 16, 18, and 20). The idea is to cut the number of cars on the road by roughly half which, the Delhi government hopes, will bring down AQI levels somewhat.

What is the timed out rule?

- According to the men's cricket World Cup 2023 playing conditions, "After the fall of a wicket or the retirement of a batter, the incoming batter must, unless Time has been called, be ready to receive the ball or for the other batter to be ready to receive the next ball within 2 minutes of the dismissal or retirement."
- If the batsman fails to do so, he will be considered out.
