


Modi to release ₹540 crore for PM-JANMAN beneficiaries



- The Union Cabinet has approved Pradhan Mantri Janjati Adivasi Nyaya Maha Abhiyan (PM JANMAN) with total outlay of Rs.24,104 crore (Central Share:Rs.15,336 crore and State Share: Rs.8,768 crore) to focus on 11 critical interventions through 9 line Ministries.
- The PM-JANMAN (comprising Central Sector and Centrally Sponsored Schemes) to focus on 11 critical interventions through 9 Ministries including Ministry of Tribal Affairs
- It is aimed to improve socio-economic conditions of the PVTGs by saturating PVTG households and habitations with basic facilities such as safe housing, clean drinking water and sanitation, improved access to education, health and nutrition, electricity, road and telecom connectivity, and sustainable livelihood opportunities.

- Every year during Gangasagar mela, devotees from all over the country gather at the confluence of the Ganga and the Bay of Bengal to take a sacred dip during Makar Sankranti (mid-January).
- Gangasagar is an island in the Ganges delta located on the continental shelf of the Bay of Bengal roughly 100 kilometres (54 nautical miles) south of Kolkata,
- The mela is said to be India's second largest pilgrimage gathering after the Kumbh Mela

Govt likely to unveil new PMAY-G version with 85% higher financial assistance

THE GOVERNMENT may unveil a new version of the Pradhan Mantri Awaas Yojana- Gramin (PMAY-G) for the next five years, with financial assistance 85 per cent higher than under the current scheme for each beneficiary, to build pucca houses in rural areas.

Currently, under the PMAY-G, the beneficiaries are provided financial assistance of Rs 1.2 lakh in plains and Rs 1.3 lakh in hilly states – Northeastern states and union territories (UTs) of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh – as well as difficult areas and Integrated Action Plan (IAP) districts. Under the revamped scheme, the cash support will likely be enhanced to an average of Rs 2.39 lakh/housing unit, according to official sources.

The current version of PMAY-G will run only till the end of the current fiscal.

An announcement could be expected in interim Budget 2024-25 to be presented in Parliament on February 1.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi has said that uplifting the poor, youth, women and farmers are his priority areas to make the country a developed nation. April 1, 2016, to assist in constructing 29.5 million pucca houses with basic amenities. Out of the overall target, 29.46 million houses have been sanctioned to states, out of which, 25.4 million houses have been completed as of January 14, 2024.

The government may save around Rs 18.000 crore in PMAY-

- The Pradhan Mantri Awaas Yojana- Gramin (PMAY-G) is being implemented with effect from 1st April, 2016 to provide assistance to eligible rural households with an overall target to construct 2.95 crore pucca houses with basic amenities by 31st March 2024
- The identification of beneficiaries under PMAY-G is based on the housing deprivation parameters and exclusion criteria prescribed under Socio Economic Caste Census (SECC)-2011 and due verification by the respective Gram Sabhas and completion of an Appellate Process.

Rare Tibetan Brown Bear Discovered in Sikkim





- It is an omnivore with its diet generally consisting of marmots and alpine vegetation.
- It inhabits high-altitude alpine forests, meadows, and steppe above 4000 m
- The Tibetan brown bear also known as the Tibetan blue bear is one of the rarest subspecies of bears in the world, and is rarely sighted in the wild.
- It is uniquely adapted to the harsh conditions of the Tibetan Plateau.
- Until now, there were only a few confirmed records from Nepal, Bhutan, and the Tibetan plateau.
- Consequently, it has been accorded the highest protection status under the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 by listing it under Schedule-I. It is also listed in Appendix I of the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species (CITES) as a protected species.
