SC strikes down electoral bonds scheme, calls it unconstitutional

5-judge Bench terms the mode of funding 'manifestly arbitrary'

It says voters' right to information about political funding is violated

Recently, the Supreme Court struck down the electoral bonds scheme as 'unconstitutional' and held that it violates the right to information under Article 19(1)(a) of the Constitution.

- The five-judge Constitution Bench quashed the amendments made to the Income Tax Act and the Representation of People Act which made the donations anonymous.
- The Court also directed the State Bank of India (the only bank authorised to sell them) to immediately stop the issuance of electoral bonds.

What is the electoral bonds scheme?

- Electoral Bonds are bearer instruments in the nature of a Promissory Note and an interest free banking instrument.
- The scheme was notified in 2018 as an alternative to cash donations made to political parties to bring transparency in political funding.
- They can be purchased by any citizen of India or entity incorporated or established in the country.

- India has rejected the demand for 'data exclusivity', as part of ongoing discussions with the European Free Trade Association (EFTA) towards a free trade agreement
 - The European Free Trade Association (EFTA) is the intergovernmental organisation of Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway and Switzerland. It was set up in 1960 for the promotion of free trade and economic integration between its members.
- Data exclusivity protects the clinical trial data of a pharmaceutical company for a particular drug.
- Generic competitors cannot apply for regulatory approval for equivalent drugs relying on the originator's data for a specified number of years. Therefore, data exclusivity lengthens the monopoly for the original drug, and hits generic drug manufacturers.
- Data exclusivity is not mandatory under TRIPS
 Agreement and India laws do not provide for it.
 - India is the largest supplier of generic medicines. It manufactures about 60,000 different generic brands across 60 therapeutic categories and accounts for 20 per cent of the global supply of generics

The **Sixth Schedule under Article 244** provides for the formation of autonomous administrative divisions — **Autonomous District Councils (ADCs)** — that have some legislative, judicial, and administrative autonomy within a state.

Application:

The Sixth Schedule applies to the Northeastern states of Assam, Meghalaya, Mizoram (three Councils each), and Tripura (one Council).

On August 5, 2019, the special status of former State of Jammu & Kashmir under Article 370 was revoked by the Parliament, and the State was bifurcated into two Union Territories — J&K and Ladakh, the latter without a Legislative Assembly.





National Coal Index Shows Decline of 4.75% in December, 2023

- The National Coal Index (Provisional) has shown a significant decline of 4.75 % in December 2023 at 155.44 points compared to December 2022, where it was at 163.19 points.
- This notable decrease indicates sufficient availability of coal in market to meet the growing demands.
 - The downward trajectory of the NCI signifies a more equitable market, harmonizing supply and demand dynamics
- The National Coal Index (NCI) is a price index that combines coal prices from all sales channels, viz. Notified Prices, Auction Prices, and Import Prices. It considers prices of coking and non-coking coal of various grades transacted in the regulated (power and fertilizer) and non-regulated sectors.
- Established with the base year as FY 2017-18, NCI serves as a reliable indicator of market dynamics, providing valuable insights of price fluctuations.
