# Cyclone Asna forms over Kutch; rain lashes Gujarat

Cyclone Asna has formed over the Kutch coast in Gujarat and adjoining areas of Pakistan, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) said on Friday. The cyclonic storm — a rare land-originating one in August and headed to the Arabian Sea — is expected to move further away from the western coast in the next 48 hours.

On the back of the cyclone, light to moderate rainfall occurred at most places in Gujarat and heavy to very heavy rainfall was reported at isolated places in Kutch and adjoining districts of Saurashtra on Friday, the IMD noted.

This is the first cyclonic storm in the Arabian Sea in August since 1976. The name Asna, meaning "the one to be acknowledged or praised", has been given by Pakistan. Between 1891

clonic storms formed in the Arabian Sea in August (in 1976, 1964, and 1944), according to IMD.

#### Low pressure off A.P.

Simultaneously, a wellmarked low pressure area – a very early precursor to a cyclone – has formed in the Bay of Bengal off north Andhra Pradesh and south Odisha. It is likely to move further west-northwestwards towards north A.P. and adjoining south Odto a depression during the next 36 hours. The IMD has forecast light rain over both States.

The build-up from cyclone Asna resulted in torrential rainfall in Gujarat this week. Rain-related incidents in Gujarat claimed 32 lives since Sunday. More than 18,000 people have been relocated, and around 1,200 rescued from flood-affected areas.

- Cyclones are caused by atmospheric disturbances around a low-pressure area distinguished by swift and often destructive air circulation. Cyclones are usually accompanied by violent storms and bad weather. The air circulates inward in an anticlockwise direction in the Northern hemisphere and clockwise in the Southern hemisphere.

# Senior bureaucrat T.V. Somanathan takes charge as Cabinet Secretary

Mr. Somanathan, a 1987batch Indian Administrative Service (IAS) officer from the Tamil Nadu cadre, holds a PhD in Economics from Calcutta University. He has also completed the Executive Development Program of Harvard Business School, and is a Chartered Accountant, Cost Accountant, and Company Secretary.

He has served as Joint Secretary and Additional

Secretary in the Prime Minister's Office. Prior to his joining as the Cabinet Secretary, he was holding the charge of Finance Secretary, and Secretary, Department of Expenditure. In Tamil Nadu, he served many key positions such as Managing Director of Chennai Metro Rail Corporation Ltd., and Secretary to the Chief Minister He was also the Additiona Chief Secretary and Commissioner of Commercia Taxes during the crucia phase of roll-out of the Goods and Services Tax.

Mr. Somanathan has al so served at multiple levels in the World Bank, including as Director betweer 2011 and 2015. He has published over 80 papers and articles in journals and newspapers on economics, finance and public policy, and is the author of three books.



- Veteran bureaucrat T.V. Somanathan took over as the Cabinet Secretary following the superannuation of Rajiv Gauba.
- The Cabinet Secretariat functions directly under the Prime Minister. The administrative head of the Secretariat is the Cabinet Secretary who is also the exofficio Chairman of the Civil Services Board. Stain's letter to Prime Minister Narendra Modi seeking the release of funds under the Samagra Shiksha scheme for FY 2024-25, Union Education Dharmendra Minister Pradhan has said that Tamil Nadu is required to sign a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) for the PM-SHRI scheme aimed at developing exemplar schools that would offer leadership to other schools in the neighbourhood.

# UCC will be a measure to ensure justice for women: Vice President Dhankhar

STRESSING ON the importance of a zero-tolerance approach towards crime against women, Vice-President Jagdeep Dhankhar on Friday said that implementing a Uniform Civil Code (UCC) would be a step forward to ensure justice for women,

Addressing students at Delhi University's Bharati College, the V-Preiterated President Droupadi Murmu's recent expression on vi-

olence against women and said "enough is enough".

"When you make a girl or a

woman a victim, you are injuring our civilisation. You are injuring sublimity. You are behaving like a monster. You are exemplifying barbarity to an extreme, draconian level. Nothing should come in the way. I want everyone in the country to heed the same sage and timely caution by the President of India." Dhankharsaid.

Mentioning that the UCC was in the Directive Principles of State Policy, the V-P said: "...the UCC, which has been on the shelf for too long, is a small measure of justice for your segment. Look around and see what it means. It will help in several ways, but mainly it will help your gender."

Further, urging young women students to become financially independent, Dhankhar said: "It is quintessentially important for you to unleash your energy and potential". "Girls are the most important stakeholders in the development of the nation. They constitute the backbone and spinal strength of the rural economy, agro-economy, and informal economy."

- A UCC seeks to create a uniform set of laws to replace the distinct personal laws of every religion pertaining to subjects such as marriage, divorce, adoption, and inheritance. This stems from Article 44 of the Constitution, which mandates that the state "shall endeavour to secure for the citizens a uniform civil code throughout the territory of India." The provision is a part of the Directive Principles of State Policy (Part IV of the Constitution), which although not enforceable, play a pivotal role in the country's governance.
- Several judicial precedents such as the Supreme Court's judgment in *Minerva Mills v. Union of India* (1980), have ruled that striking a balance between fundamental rights and Directive Principles of State Policy was part of the basic structure of the Constitution.

# DGTR recommends anti-dumping duty on aluminium foils imported from China

THE DIRECTORATE General of TradeRemedies (DGTR) under the Ministry of Commerce and Industry on Friday recommended the imposition of an anti-dumping duty on aluminium foils imported from China, after observing that Chinese imports had captured 30 per cent of the Indian market despite sufficient domestic capacity.

This follows a request for an inquiry from Hindalco, one of India's largest aluminium manufacturing companies, on the grounds of injury to domestic companies. Other applicants included Shyam Sel & Power Ltd, Venkateshwara Electrocast Pvt. Ltd, and Ravi Raj Foils Ltd.

Anti-dumping investigations

are conducted by countries to determine whether domestic industries have been harmed due to a surge in cheap imports. The Ministry of Finance makes the final decision on whether to impose duties. The DGTR stated that imports of "aluminium foil up to 80 microns, excluding aluminium foil below 5.5 microns for non-capacitor applications," are undercutting the prices of the domestic industry. This price undercutting has forced the domestic industry to reduce its selling price below the cost of production, the DGTR said. The foil is used as a packaging material for the conservation and preservation of edible and food
