- Delhi Chief Minister Atishi on Thursday said her government is "in-principle" ready for the implementation of the Centre's flagship health insurance scheme — Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (PM-JAY) — in the Capital.
- The Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (PM-JAY), launched on September 23, 2018, is a key initiative for achieving Universal Health Coverage (UHC) in India. It is part of the broader Ayushman Bharat program, introduced under the National Health Policy 2017.
- The scheme targets over 12 crore families, covering around 55 crore individuals, with a focus on the poorest 40% of the population as identified by the Socio-Economic Caste Census 2011. PM-JAY provides health coverage of up to ₹5 lakh per family annually for secondary and tertiary care hospitalization, making it the world's largest health assurance scheme. The scheme aims to provide healthcare to the most vulnerable sections of society.

India tests ballistic missile with a range of around 3,500 km

India has tested a nuclear-capable ballistic missile with a range of around 3,500 km from a nuclear-powered submarine in the Bay of Bengal, in a major boost to its nuclear deterrence and strategic capabilities, sources said on Thursday. With this, India became part of a small group of nations having the capability to fire a nuclear missile from land, air and undersea. The K4 missile was tested from INS Arighaat off the coast of Visakhapatnam on Wednesday, the sources said. It was the first test of the submarine-launched ballistic missile (SLBM) from a submarine, the sources said.



- India successfully tested the nuclear-capable K4 ballistic missile, with a range of around 3,500 km, from the nuclear-powered submarine INS Arighaat in the Bay of Bengal.
- This marks a significant boost to India's nuclear deterrence and strategic capabilities, making it one of the few nations capable of launching nuclear missiles from land, air, and sea. pleted his schooling from Modern School, Barakhamba Road, and obtained a BA (Hons) in History from Hindu College. He got his LLB in 1987 from Campus Law Centre, University of Delhi, and enrolled as an advocate with the Bar Council of Delhi the same year.

He practiced primarily in the Supreme Court and Delhi High Court in civil. criminal. constitutional, taxation, arbitration, trademark, and service matters. He also served as a senior panel advocate for the Government of India in the High Court and the Supreme Court.

lustice Manmohan was designated as senior advocate by the High Court of Delhi on January 18, 2003.

He was appointed additional judge of the High Court of Delhi on March 13, 2008, and as permanent judge on December 17. 2009.



The collegium system emerged from years of friction between the judiciary and the executive, involving courtpacking, mass transfer of judges, and supersessions. Three Judges Cases:

First Judges Case: Consultation with the Chief Justice of India (CJI) should be "full and effective."

Second Judges Case: Introduced the collegium system in 1993; CJI must consult the two senior-most judges for judicial appointments.

Third Judges Case: Expanded the collegium to include the CJI and four senior-most judges.

The collegium of the CJI and four senior-most Supreme Court judges recommends appointments to the apex court and High Courts.

- A study led by Yuming Guo from Monash University highlights the severe health risks from wildfires, particularly due to PM2.5 emissions. Key points include: Globally, over 1.53 million deaths could be attributed to landscape fire incidents.
- In 2018, there were 221 direct deaths from landscape fires, but pollution from these fires causes far more health issues.
- At least 90% of PM2.5 emissions from landscape fires are due to wildfires, and this is likely to increase with climate change.
- The study reports around 450,000 annual deaths from cardiovascular disease and 220,000 from respiratory disease due to fire pollution.
 - It emphasizes geographic and socio-economic differences in mortality and an increasing trend of cardiovascular deaths linked to fire pollution.

Gujarat Leads In Rooftop Solar System Installations Under PM-Surya Ghar Muft Bijli Yojana: Shripad Naik





- The PM Surya Ghar Muft Bijlee Yojana is a Central government initiative aimed at providing free electricity to one crore households in India that install rooftop solar systems.
- Eligible households will receive 300 units of free electricity every month. Approved by the Union Cabinet in February with an outlay of Rs. 75,021 crore, the scheme offers a subsidy on solar units: 60% for systems up to 2 kW and 40% for systems between 2 to 3 kW, capped at 3 kW. The subsidy can amount to Rs. 30,000 for 1 kW systems, Rs. 60,000 for 2 kW, and Rs. 78,000 for 3 kW systems.

India And Russia Agree To Increase Joint Military Exercises





The fourth meeting of the Working Group on Military Cooperation under the India – Russia Inter-Governmental Commission on Military and Military-Technical Cooperation, concluded successfully in Moscow Russia.

Defence Ministry said, the meeting marked a significant milestone in advancing the long-standing Strategic Partnership between the two countries.

The Working Group emphasised the importance of continued knowledge-sharing and collaboration in areas of strategic interest. It also agreed upon expanding joint exercises to further solidifying the operational synergy between the two forces.

The Declaration on the India-Russia Strategic Partnership was signed in 2000, which was elevated to the level of Special and Privileged Strategic Partnership in 2010. The Working Group, a crucial forum for India-Russia defence cooperation, provides a platform to assess existing military engagements and identified new areas for collaboration to address evolving security challenges.

Masato Kanda Elected As ADB President





- The Asian Development Bank (ADB) Board of Governors has unanimously elected Masato Kanda as its 11th President. Kanda, currently serving as Special Advisor to Japan's Prime Minister and Minister of Finance, will assume office in February next year, succeeding Masatsugu Asakawa.
- He will complete the remaining term of Asakawa, which ends in November 2026. Established in 1966 and headquartered in Manila, Philippines, ADB has grown from 31 members to 68, working to promote social and economic development in Asia through its network of 31 field offices.
