Trump weighs in on H-1B: Been a believer... great programme

'Always been in favour of the visas... many H-1B visas on my properties'

NEW DELHI, DECEMBER 29

AMID THE public row among his supporters over the H-1B visa programme, US President-elect Donald Trump has backed key ally Elon Musk, calling himself a "believer in H-1B" and saying he has "always been in favour of the visas".

"I've always liked the visas, I have always been in favour of the visas. That's why we have them," Trump said in a telephone interview with the New York Post on Saturday. "I have many H-1B visas on my properties. I've been a believer in H-1B. I have used it many times. It's a great programme," he said.



DURING DONALD Trump's first term as US President, his administration imposed restrictions on H-1B visas, citing concerns over "abuse" and "economic strain". His hard line on immigration. focussed mostly on illegal entrants, formed an important part of his campaign this time too. His support for H-1B comes at a time when the programme faces intense scrutiny, including from a



President-elect Donald Trump expressed support for H-1B visas, citing their importance for hiring skilled workers.

What is the H-1B visa program?

- The programme allows American employers to hire nonimmigrant workers in specialty occupations that require a high level of skills and at least a bachelor's degree, according to the US Department of Labour.
- "The intent of the H-1B provisions is to help employers who cannot otherwise obtain needed business skills and abilities from the US workforce by authorising the temporary employment of qualified individuals who are not otherwise authorised to work in the United States,"

- The Indian Army contingent comprising 334 personnel departed for Nepal today to participate in 18th edition of Battalion Level Joint Military Exercise SURYA KIRAN. The exercise will be conducted in Saljhandi, Nepal from 31st December 2024 to 13th January 2025. It is an annual training event conducted alternatively in the two countries.
- The Indian Army contingent is being led by a Battalion from the 11th Gorkha Rifles. The Nepal Army contingent will be represented by Srijung Battalion.
- The aim of Exercise SURYA KIRAN is to enhance interoperability in jungle warfare, counter terrorism operations in mountains, and Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief under United Nations Charter. SpaDeX, India's final Space Mission for 2024: How ISRO will dock 2 satellites in space with PSLV rocket's round design

"SpaDEX" will mark a milestone, showcasing India's expertise in spacecraft docking technology



- ISRO's year-end mission scheduled for 30th December is going to be a historic one as it will seek the rare feat of docking or merging or joining together two satellites in Space. The project has been named "Space Docking Experiment" (SpaDeX)
- SpaDeX mission is a cost-effective technology demonstrator mission for the demonstration of in-space docking using two small spacecraft launched by PSLV. This technology is essential for India's space ambitions such as Indian on Moon, sample return from the Moon, the building and operation of Bharatiya Antariksh Station (BAS), etc. In-space docking technology is essential when multiple rocket launches are required to achieve common mission objectives. Through this mission, India is marching towards becoming the fourth country in the world to have space docking technology.
