- The Union Health Ministry said on Friday that it was closely monitoring the alleged outbreak of Human Metapneumovirus (HMPV) in China. The Ministry said while China had reported a rise in respiratory illness, particularly HMPV, India had not registered any unusual spike in winter respiratory diseases.
- Five years after the COVID pandemic, China is experiencing a surge in HMPV cases, particularly in children under 14 years. Symptoms include cough, fever, and shortness of breath, with potential complications like bronchitis and pneumonia.
- Discovered in 2001, the HMPV belongs to the Pneumoviridae family along with respiratory syncytial virus (RSV). Broader use of molecular diagnostic testing has increased identification and awareness of HMPV as an important cause of upper and lower respiratory infection.

The Union government on Friday released the draft Digital Personal Data Protection (DPDP) Rules, 2025, which will enforce provisions of the Digital Personal Data Protection Act, 2023. While the Act was passed more than a year ago, the rules that will result in its enforcement have thus far been under development, and are only now being floated for public consultation. The DPDP Act provides a legal framework for "data fiduciaries" - entities that collect personal data from "data principals" or users in order to protect that data against misuse and penalise firms that violate data protection principles.




Prime Minister remembers Rani Velu Nachiyar on her birth anniversary

- The Directorate General of Foreign Trade (DGFT) on Thursday notified amendment in the Foreign Trade Policy, 2023 to include Para 1.07A and 1.07B to bring legal backing in the FTP to make it necessary to do consultation with stakeholders to seek views, suggestions, comments or feedback from relevant stakeholders, including importers/exporters/industry experts concerning the formulation or amendment of the Foreign Trade Policy.
- It also provides the mechanism to inform reasons for not accepting views, suggestions, comments or feedback concerning the formulation or amendment of the Foreign Trade Policy, 2023.
- The latest amendments in the Foreign Trade Policy, 2023 reflect upon the Central Government's commitment towards strengthening the scope of Ease of Doing Business (EoDB) in India by encouraging stakeholder and expert participation through consultation in the decisionmaking process.

5 Countries Assume Responsibilities As Elected Members Of UN Security Council





- Denmark, Greece, Pakistan, Panama and Somalia began their two-year term as non-permanent members of the United Nations Security Council yesterday. The five countries replaced Ecuador, Japan, Malta, Mozambique and Switzerland. A flag installation ceremony was held at the United Nations headquarters in New York to mark the start of their responsibilities. The permanent representatives of the five new members made short speeches before they installed their respective national flags outside the Security Council Chamber.
- The UNSC currently comprises 15 members five permanent and 10 elected members who have two-year terms. The United States, the United Kingdom, Russia, China and France are the permanent members of the UNSC all of whom have the power of the veto. Collectively, this group is called the P5
