1. Why is caste identity in India is both fluid and static?	The dichotomy in public and private life in Indian society acts as a major barrier to the annihilation of caste. Justify. (FLT 1 Q10) Is the institution of caste changing or disintegrating in contemporary Indian society.
2. Does urbanization lead to more segregation and /or marginalization of poor in Indian metropolises?	Slums are not 'problems' that have to be 'solved' – but are indeed a result of lopsided and vested urban policies covering infrastructure provision and socio-economic issues. Analyse.
3. The states in India seem reluctant to empower urban local bodies both functionally as well as financial. Comment.	The key to effective decentralization is, 'political decentralization should follow finance and functional decentralization'. Discuss in the context of impediments faced by local governance in India.
4. "Constitutionally guaranteed judicial independence is a prerequisite of democracy" Comment.	"Constitution envisages an independent judiciary, not insulated judiciary"; In the light of the given statement, discuss the issues associated with the appointment of judges in the higher judiciary and explore alternatives to the current system.
5. Account for the legal and political factors responsible for the reduced frequency of using Article 356 by the Union Governments since mid 1990s.	'S.R. Bommai v. Union of India signified a paradigm shift in the judicial interpretation of the union's authority to assume control of a state's administration.' In this context discuss the significance and impact of the judgement on cementing the federal structure.
6. How does e-technology help farmers in production and marketing of agricultural produce? Explain.	Despite being a major contributor to the Indian economy, the agriculture sector is plagued by several constraints that impede its growth and development. Examine the role of technology in overcoming these constraints.
7. The use of Unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs) by our adversaries across the borders to ferry arms/ammunitions, drugs etc., is a serious threat to the internal security. Comment on the measures being taken to tackle this threat.	The anonymity and ease of drone operation contribute to the challenges of India's border security. Elaborate and give suggestions to tackle the drone problem in border areas.
8. What are internal security challenges being faced by India? Give out the role of central intelligence and investigative agencies to counter such threats	Do you think that intelligence and law enforcement agencies in India have the necessary resources and capabilities to effectively tackle the link between organised crime and terrorism?
9. State the objectives and measures of land reforms in India. Discuss how land ceiling policy on landholding can be considered as an effective reform under economic criteria.	Analyze the systemic and institutional constraints that continue to hinder land reform efforts in India and propose pragmatic solutions to ensure equitable distribution of land.
